



Course Outline – Juniors Advanced Level A2

This course is for **learners from 10 years of age or grade 5 in school**, who successfully completed the "*Juniors Explorers*" course or can demonstrate the German language at that level.

This is an engaging course with a communicative approach to extended grammar and vocabulary acquisition. It also provides lots of opportunities to increase student's communicative fluency as well as their German reading and writing skills. It caters for different abilities and learning styles and it encourages students to make cultural references, thereby gaining a better understanding of cultural differences.

- Describing how they injured themselves
- Talking about what happened in school
- Telling their own story

- Talking about health issues, sickness and medications
- Introducing people living in their part of town
- Finding their way around town
- Talking about where to meet
- Talking about public transport
- Talking about famous people and their lives
- Discussing and comparing German towns and cars
- Exchanging Information about birth dates and star signs
- Talking about birthday invitations and presents
- Saying how they celebrate their birthday
- Discussing holiday destinations
- Expressing their and other people's holiday plans
- Talking about what to do on holidays
- Talking about the weather
- Discussing jobs and careers
- Saying what career they have in mind
- Discussing statistics of most popular male and female occupations
- Talking about activities students have in mind after finishing school
- Exchanging memories about their first day in school
